Each year, the Epilepsy Foundation selects one or two children living with epilepsy to help raise awareness and let other children know they are not alone. Our "Winning Kids" symbolize the spirit and courage that all children with epilepsy display in dealing with this disorder.

This year, Adaline (Addy) Casey and Ada Jordan were named our Winning Kids for their kindness, resilience, and dedication to Kids Crew.

Addy and Ada were featured on billboards across the Capital Region this summer, showing the world what courage looks like. Thank you both for being incredible ambassadors!





Adaline "Addy" Casey is a vibrant and determined six-year-old who refuses to let epilepsy define her. Diagnosed with focal epilepsy after experiencing infantile spasms and atonic seizures as a baby, Addy has faced many challenges- but her joy and resilience shine through. Whether she's playing soccer, riding horses, swimming, or cheering on her brother's lacrosse team, Addy embraces life with enthusiasm. Her family has been proactive in raising epilepsy awareness, ensuring her school staff received seizure first-aid training to keep Addy and others safe.

Addy's progress in physical therapy and growing independence on the playground are just a few examples of her unstoppable spirit. She and her family are active members of the Northeastern New York epilepsy community, participating in Kids Crew events and forming "Team Addy" for EFNENY's Walk for Epilepsy.

Despite her epilepsy, Addy knows she can do anything she puts her mind to!

At just five years old, Ada Jordan has shown remarkable strength and compassion through her journey with epilepsy. Diagnosed the week of her first birthday, Ada experienced focal impaired awareness seizures that became increasingly difficult to manage. After a month-long hospital stay, her seizures were controlled with medication- until they returned with greater intensity a year later. In 2023, Ada bravely underwent brain surgery, and since then, she has been seizure-free.

Beyond her medical journey, Ada is growing into a kind and empathetic young girl who instinctively cares for others facing challenges. Her parents describe her as someone who notices when others are hurting and eagerly offers support. Ada's courage in medical settings and her nurturing spirit make her a role model in the epilepsy community. Her family led "Team Ada" at this year's EFNENY Walk for Epilepsy and looks forward to staying involved within their community.



Ada would like others to know the battle with epilepsy is often a daily one, but the warriors who fight it are mighty and resilient!

Since 1969, November has been recognized as National Epilepsy Awareness Month (NEAM), thanks to the efforts of the Epilepsy Foundation and a formal resolution passed by Congress in 2003. NEAM is a time dedicated to raising awareness, sharing stories, and educating others about epilepsy and seizure safety.

NEAM is more than just a calendar event—it's a movement. Each November, the epilepsy community comes together to shed light on the realities of living with seizures, challenge the stigma, and promote safety and preparedness. It's a time to amplify voices, foster empathy, and encourage meaningful conversations that can lead to change.

This year's theme, "All In for National Epilepsy Awareness Month," is a powerful call to action. SEIZURE SAFETY IN NYS SCHOOLS: THE SEIZURE SAFE SCHOOLS ACT

New York State legislators are considering a bill that would make schools safer for students with epilepsy across the state.

WHAT DO BILL <u>A.8726</u> & <u>S.7445</u> ENTAIL?

Requiring Seizure Action Plans

Seizure action plans will be required to be kept on file at the school nurse's office for each child with a known seizure disorder & distributed to relevant school personnel and staff.

2 Increased trainings for staff

Approved seizure awareness training will be required for relevant school staff members every other year.

3 Increased trainings for students

Approved seizure awareness trainings will be required to be offered to school students K-12.

1 Trainings for emergency events

At least one individual will be trained in seizure rescue medication administration by the school nurse to ensure at least two individuals will be trained and available in the event of an emergency.

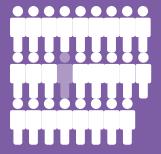

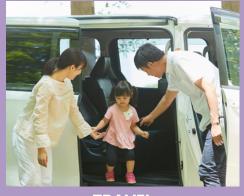


RIDE SHARE TRANSPORTATION FUND

With support from the Community Foundation for the Greater Capital Region, this travel fund assists individuals with epilepsy who cannot drive or use public transportation due to active seizures. Eligible applicants must live within our service area and lack access to personal transportation.

The fund covers travel for medical appointments, counseling, support groups, Studio E, educational programs, Epilepsy Foundation events, grocery trips, and social visits.

TRAVEL ASSISTANCE FUNDS

BARBARA QUACKENBUSH

Barbara Quackenbush experienced her first seizure at age 38 but wasn't diagnosed with epilepsy until more than a decade later. After years of trying different medications, a change in doctors finally led to effective treatment. Despite the challenges —including periods without a driver's license while raising children—she built a successful career as a middle school principal and later a school superintendent.

Motivated by her journey, Barbara joined the Board of Directors at the Epilepsy Foundation of Northeastern New York, serving for ten years. Her work deepened her commitment to supporting others with epilepsy. When the Purple Legacy Society was introduced, she included the Foundation in her estate plans to help sustain its vital programs and services.
